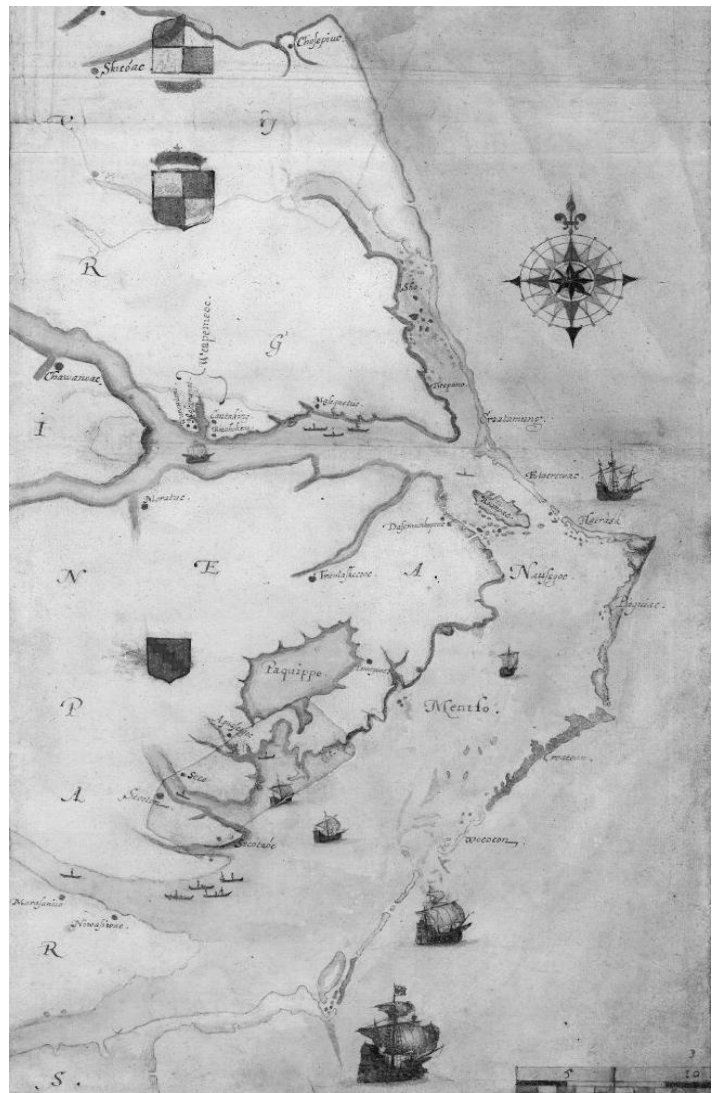
Look at map of Roanoke to the right.

Find the compass rose that shows directions. Label the four main compass rose points with N (north), S (south), E (east), and W (west).

Can you find Roanoke on the map? Follow these directions to find it! Place your finger on the compass rose. Now slide your finger south and slightly east off the compass rose to find the nearest ship. Now move your finger west until you come to Roanoke. If you hit the mainland you've gone too far. Circle Roanoke Island in RED.

Draw a BLUE arrow in the ocean on the map to show the direction you would sail if you were a Roanoke colonist and you wanted to sail back to England. (HINT: You would have to sail EAST to get to England)

Look at the map below. In the map, you can see the outlines of modern-day Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Georgia. Roanoke Island is located where the arrow is pointing. Put a red X on it. What state is Roanoke Island located in today? Label the state on the map.
